

15. SKILL AND ENTERPRINUERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

15.1 *To lift young people in rural India out of poverty.*

They need practical skills for trades, upgrading, marketing and managerial training SASSS has established vocational trainings that provide skill development in a wide variety of professional fields.



Skill deficiency in India is a huge challenge. Reports indicates that the worst pool of the rural youth in India are marginalized have no- low opportunities for skill building and little access to sustainable livelihood. One of the reasons for this is lack of access to any sort of skill trainings. They rely mostly on agricultural or local livelihood opportunities which are fast diminishing.

These are resulting in un-employability of the youth that are unskilled and are unable to match their skills. The available job opportunities are due to an inefficient market place. This is especially true for the blue color and low ended white color jobs. If India's is not appropriately skilled and lined with current livelihood options at the right age they will never generate massive jobs opportunities in the future. Seeing this situation SASSS has initiated to establish

20 women had been trained on this.

Some are working in the unit and some involved in marketing.

So we are happy that they are able to earn Rs 150 per day.



15.3 TIFFIN PLATES PRODUCTION UNIT TRAINING



20 youth had been trained on Tiffin plate's production and packing unit and trained in hand made missions where they can establish at their homes and can get Rs 200 per day.

We having tie-up with Siva Reddy who accepted to provide raw material and accepted to market the finished goods. So with this we feel that we can provide at least for 25 families employment with simple investment to buy a handmade mission and set at home and can do their work in the house whenever they are free and the family members also can be involved.



So with these two programs experience that we can train many youth in different trades can improve their skills and can get employment in production companies or can start their own units.

Participation in the services of the poor

Mr . Bosco and Tecla had come forward to write last will to contribute their building in Bangalore for the services of the poor. They also allowed us freely to built second floor on their building. This year the society had built second floor on Bosco and Tecla building. Now we are getting Rs. 23,000 per month through which we are planning to run adult home for disabled.
